Oak Tree Pavilion

Oak Tree Pavilion is a 5,000-squarefoot amenity building for Ovation at Oak Tree, a senior residential community at 8929 36th Ct .S.E. in Lacey.

The concept called for connection to and inspiration from the old stands of oak trees adjacent to the site. The result is a warm, textural interior that envelops the space in natural materials, with subtly shifting light and shadow playing off the weather and time of day.

Simple materials and a restrained color palette allow the floor-to-ceiling views to take center stage. The large decorative pendants in the main gathering area continue the repetition of steely matte black accents and feature glowing coils of natural wood veneer.


